Longtime Demo Leader Here Dies

Charles Albert (Carl) Longue-mare, prominent Lower Valley farmer and former chairman of El Peso County Democratic Executive Committee, died in his home near Ysleta Friday. He was 75.

Mr. Longuemare was born in Otero, N. M., May 25, 1879, and moved to El Paso with his family when he was five. During his early youth he delivered a newspaper route for The Times.

He counted among his newspaper clients John Wesley Hardin, who in the 1890s was rated at the most deadly gunman in Texas because of his fantastic speed and skill with a brace of six shooters.

His first meeting with the notorious Texas gunman was when, as a Western Union messenger boy, he was given a collect message to de-liver to flardin.

He recalled how Hardin, after paying him for the telegram, told him never to bring him another collect telegram.

For more than 40 years. Mr. Lon-guemare took an active part in the Democratic Party. He was elected that many of the Democratic Faculty Committee in 1950 and feelected in 1952 Last April he an-nounced he was retiring from poli-

tics because of ill health.

Survivers include a daughter leta, one brother. Noel, also of Ys-leta, and two sisters, Mrs. James Mooney of Washington,—D. C. and Mrs. Julius A. Raterman of El Paso. Funeral-arrangements were pend

ing with Harding and Orr Funeral

Home.

He has the son of the late CharHe Longuemare and Palmyra Delton Longuemare. His father pub(Combinised on Page 6, Column 2)

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lished the mining industry newspaper "Bullion" in the early 1880s. with office in Socorro, N. M., and El Paso.

In 1888, Mr. Longuemare named as mascot of a West Point Cadet Corps organized in El Paso. and given a gray Confederate suit. He joined the Border Rifles at the outbreak of the Spanish-American
War, and stayed with the company
until the outbreak of World War I.
Later he entered the field business, and was a bookkeeper for the
Watts Water Co. for many years.

Mr. Longuemare also was a former employe of the Texas Liquor Control Board in El Paso.
