

PROF. LONGUEMARE

NOTED SCIENTIST DIED YESTERDAY AT HOTEL DIEU.

A Pioneer of El Paso and Author of Many Articles on Scientific Subjects—Interment Occurs Today at Concordia Cemetery—Has Been Ill Some Time.

Professor Charles Longuemare, one of El Paso's most highly esteemed citizens, passed away yesterday at Hotel Dieu. The deceased had been in failing health for a number of years and his condition recently became so serious that he was taken to Hotel Dieu in the hope that his life might be saved. Professor Longuemare was one of the most learned men in certain lines in this section of the country. He was a geologist and mineralogist of considerable note and has contributed many able articles to magazines on the geological peculiarities of the southwest. His articles on the old volcanic regions around Socorro, New Mexico, attracted considerable attention.

He was a member of the Pioneer society of this city and had many friends among the older residents. He leaves a widow and four children, three of whom reside in this city: Noel Longuemare, a valued employe of the El Paso smelter; Carl, a clerk for the El Paso Water Works, and Miss Marie. A married daughter resides in Nashville, Tenn.

The funeral will take place this morning at 9 o'clock from the Church of the Immaculate Conception. Interment in Concordia cemetery.
