

Mrs. Laura Loomis, Aged Pioneer Dies At Daughter's Home

Mrs. Laura Loomis died this morning at 10 o'clock in the home of her daughter, Mrs. M. H. Webb, 913 Lee street.

Mrs. Loomis was the widow of A. M. Loomis who died a number of years ago. They were pioneers here and Mrs. Loomis had many friends in the city.

Funeral arrangements have not yet been made.

Funeral Today For Pioneer El Pasoan

Funeral services for Lottie A. Loomis, 70, pioneer El Pasoan, who died at her home, 913 Lee street, yesterday, will be held this afternoon at 3 o'clock from the First Presbyterian church. Dr. Floyd Fox will officiate. Burial will be in Evergreen cemetery under the direction of Peak-Hagedorn. Pallbearers will be Malcolm Webb, Jr., Boale Webb, Noel Longmeyer, Jules Carlin, Edward Bertien and Charles H. Loomis.

Mrs. Loomis, who had been a resident of El Paso for the past 44 years, is survived by two daughters, Mrs. M. H. Webb, El Paso, and Mrs. W. G. Duan of Kansas City, Mo., and two sons, A. M. and Ralph Loomis, both of San Diego, Cal.

Mrs. Loomis was born in California on May 8, 1866, the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Clark M. Joslyn. In 1872 she married Albert M. Loomis in California. Mr. Loomis died in March, 1901.

She was one of the organizers of the El Paso Woman's club, and served as president of the Pioneer Women's association.
