

Rites For Pioneer El Paso Railroad Man Here Tuesday

Funeral services for John Edwin Lundy, 64, pioneer El Paso railroad man, who died Sunday, will be held at 2 p. m. Tuesday in the chapel of the Kaster & Maxon mortuary. El Paso lodge No. 130, A. F. & A. M., will conduct the services.

Mr. Lundy, who came to El Paso 30 years ago, aided in the construction of the first railroads into this city. He is said to have been at the throttle of the first train run out of El Paso to Bisbee, Ariz.

He was the second oldest man in the service of the old El Paso & Southwestern railroad at the time that line was merged with the Southern Pacific. He was seventh man in seniority with the latter company.

Mr. Lundy was a Mason, a Knight Templar and a Shriner, and a member of the Brotherhood of Locomotive Engineers. He is survived by his widow; three children, Jack and Jean Lundy and Mrs. Chris P. Fox, all of El Paso.
