VALLEY PHYSICIAN IS FOUND DEAD

Dr. Frank W. Lynch Dies During Sleep

Refusal to go to bed when ill with influenza and continued attendance on patients in the Lower Valley, probably hastened the death of Dr. Frank W. Lynch, Lower Valley, who died today at 1:30 a. m. of cerebral hemorrhage, his friends said today. Dr. Lynch was found dead in his bed.

He was 57.

The funeral will be held tomorrow at 10:30 a.m. in Hartford Mortuary Chapel, Burial will be in Evergreen Cometery,

Dr. Lynch had lived here for 26 years. He was born in Alba Pa., Feb. 22, 1879, and was a graduate of the University of Pennsylvania. He received his M. D. in Pennsylvania.

As a young man, he was member of the civil engineering crew which laid out Cloudcroft, El Pasoans of early days recalled today. He was formerly connected with the Alamogordo Lumber Co. He has been practicing medicine here for many years.

Dr. Lynch is survived by his widow, Mrs. Lena Falvey Lynch, of the Lower Valley, member of an old Tennessee family, a sister, Mrs. Carrie Lynch Barber, and a brother, Dr. S. E. Lynch, both of Pennsylvania.
