

Nemesio N. Madrid, County Pioneer, Dies

Nemesio N. Madrid died on Sunday, April, 8, at his residence, the "White House," on the county road. He leaves his mother, a brother, a wife and four children: N. M. Madrid Jr., J. O. Madrid and Felix Madrid. N. M. and J. O. Madrid are married and all reside in the old homestead.

Mr. Madrid was born October 24, 1873, and was, from his boyhood, a very industrious and energetic man in business. He was highly esteemed by those who were in contact with him socially and otherwise. He was a native El Pasoan and lived here all his life. At the time of his death he was a deputy sheriff and faithfully discharged his duties as such. Mr. Madrid was engaged in farming and in the mercantile business.

In the death of Mr. Madrid the community loses one of its most esteemed and worthy citizens, and his family have the sympathy of a large circle of friends.

Funeral services will be held at San Ignacio Catholic church next Saturday, at 7 a. m., and he will be buried in the Concordia cemetery Sunday, April 15, at 2 p. m. The funeral will start from No. 412 South St. Vrain street. Friends are invited to attend.
