

Mrs. Lavinia T. Maple, Old Resident, Is Dead

Mrs. Lavinia T. Maple, 76 years old, a pioneer resident of El Paso, died yesterday morning at 4 o'clock at the home of her daughter, Mrs. N. G. Buchoz, in the Victoria apartments. Uremic poisoning caused her death. She had been ill for some time.

Mrs. Maple was a native of Lewis county, Kentucky. Her husband, A. H. Maple, was killed in a railroad accident in 1891. A year afterward she came to El Paso with her children. She was a member of the Baptist church.

The deceased is survived by two sisters and a brother. They are Mrs. J. A. Smith, El Paso; Mrs. E. C. Mitchell, New York city; and Jim Kendrick, El Paso. The children are: Herbert S. Maple, a linotype operator; Mrs. J. H. Clegg, Los Angeles; Mrs. Numa G. Buchoz, El Paso; and H. M. Maple, El Paso. Mrs. Clegg arrived in the city yesterday afternoon to attend the funeral.

The funeral will be held from the chapel of the McBean, Simmons & Hartford Undertaking company this morning at 10 o'clock. The Rev. O. J. Wade will officiate. Burial will be in Evergreen cemetery.
