

Dr. W. Q. Marsh.

Died: On April 20, 1907, in this city, Dr. William Q. Marsh, of Sierra Mojada, Mexico. The passing away of this splendid man will fill with sorrow the heart of every one whose privilege it was to know him, and robs the world of one of the noblest, rarest examples of manhood.

With those who knew Dr. Marsh no words of praise can increase the measure of their esteem, admiration and affection for him.

Dr. Marsh was born at Chillicothe, Ohio, in 1854 and passed his earlier years at Lucas, Iowa. He received his education in the common schools and later devoted some time to teaching.

He was graduated from the Ann Arbor, Mich., Medical College with high honors and entered upon a long and useful professional career, wherein his sterling qualities of mind and heart were blended with his rare skill as a practitioner, and earned for him the confidence, admiration and esteem of every one touched by the magic of his influence.

About the year 1889 Dr. Marsh was selected as chief surgeon to several extensive mining and railroad interests centered at Sierra Mojada in the state of Coahuila, Mexico, where he has ever since resided, devoting his time and talents exclusively to his professional work, although many tempting commercial opportunities have vainly presented themselves to him. He has twice been honored by high official position, with the International association of Railway Surgeons.

He leaves a widow and two children whose loss in his death cannot be measured in words.

Dr. Marsh's remains were buried at Concordia cemetery, under Masonic direction at 4 o'clock this afternoon.
