

ARCHITECT CHAS. MAYDWELL.

Died at His Home on Oregon Street Yesterday Evening.

Charley Maydwell, the well-known architect who designed and built the fire department and police quarters and also designed the new city hall now under construction, died last evening at 6 o'clock at his home, 418 North Oregon street, of consumption.

Deceased was 38 years of age and leaves a widow and three children. He came here a little more than a year ago from Denver, but his home was in Memphis, Tenn., where he was at one time the most prominent young architect in the city. His health failed, however, and he went to Denver and finally to El Paso. His health had been failing for some time and while not entirely unexpected, the end was sudden.

The remains were turned over to Undertaker Nagley to be prepared for burial. Due notice of the funeral will be given, as soon as the relatives of the deceased at Memphis have been communicated with, for it is not yet known whether the body will be buried here or shipped to Tennessee for interment.

A short time ago Mr. Maydwell brought suit against Contractor Crawford for \$17,000 damages, complaining that he had been assaulted and seriously injured. The suit is still pending, but it is not known whether the assault hastened the architect's end or not. He was, however, confined to his bed for some weeks after its occurrence.
