

Prominent Attorney Succumbs

J. G. McGrady, 66, Dies In
El Paso Home Following
Influenza Attack.

Funeral Tomorrow

Was Well Known Over State
As Well-Informed On
Matters Of Law.

John Gideon McGrady, 66, prominent El Paso attorney and clubman, died at the family residence, 1901 Happer street, at 2:50 p. m. yesterday. He had been in ill health for many years, but his last illness followed an attack of influenza last November.

Mr. McGrady, affectionately called "Judge" by his friends and associates, was born near Bonham, Texas, Oct. 9, 1867. He practiced law there until 1908 when he moved to Fort Worth where he practiced his profession for two years before moving to El Paso.

Three years after coming to El Paso he became a partner in the law firm of Lea, McGrady, Thomason and Edwards and was an active member of that firm until his death.

Mr. McGrady never aspired to public office of any kind. He was known throughout the state as one of the best lawyers before the bar. He took a keen personal pride in his knowledge of law.

He was married to Mrs. Kathryn Knoblauch in May, 1928.

He is survived by his widow; two sons, John LeRoy of El Paso, and Charles McGrady of Elizabeth, N. J.; a brother, H. P. McGrady of Abilene, and a sister, Mrs. E. D. Hester of Throckmartin, Texas.

Funeral services will be held at the Hartford chapel tomorrow afternoon. Pallbearers will be Eugene T. Edwards, Judge E. F. Higgins, M. Nagle, Judge P. R. Price, Louis A. Scott and Tom Lea.
