DIES IN CHICAGO

**Had Been Identified With Business
Interests of El Paso Since 1881.
Leaves a Wife and Four Daughters.**

M. F. McLean, who for a period extending over twenty years has been identified with business enterprises in El Paso, died on the night of May 12 in Chicago.

Mr. McLean was 48 years of age at the time of his death. He came to El Paso in 1881 and ever since had been interested in business in the city. From 1889 to 1893 he was associated with Theo. Eggers in the Wigwam. He leaves a wife and four daughters, Frankie, Josie, Edna and Fannie.

Mr. McLean was one of the best known sporting men in the United States and was a very particular friend of Dan Stuart. Many friends in El Paso will be deeply grieved to hear of his death. Like many who have followed the same business, Mr. McLean was known as a very liberal-hearted man and one who was strictly square in all his dealings. The funeral takes place in Chicago today. The Zeiger club rooms will be closed today out of respect to the deceased. He held an interest in them at the time of his death.
