

W. O. M'NARY DIES FOLLOWING STROKE

To Be Buried on Anniversary of
His Father's Funeral

William O. McNary, 58, of Denver, counsel for the federal prohibition district including Colorado and New Mexico, who died early today will be buried next Saturday, exactly a year later than his father was buried in Pittsburgh.

He suffered a stroke of apoplexy, Sunday and never recovered.

McNary is the brother of James G. McNary of Santa Fe and El Paso, New Mexico Republican leader, and Mrs. Henry T. Bowie, 3618 Fort Boulevard.

Mrs. Bowie will leave tonight to attend the funeral. Jas. McNary is recovering from an operation and physicians will not permit him to make the trip.

McNary was born in Bloomington, Ind., educated at Tarkio college and University of Michigan. He practiced law in Pittsburgh before coming to the southwest. He lived at Chamberino, N. M. for more than 10 years and frequently visited El Paso.
