

Strangely Alike, Deaths Of Father And Son, W. Meisel

William Meisel, pioneer labor man of El Paso, will be buried Armistice day, six years to the hour after the interment of his father in the family plot.

Fatal coincidence timed the death of William Meisel for early morning November 9, the same chill hour and day that took life from his parent.

Labor men of the city are uniting to honor the body of a leader and fellow worker, who has served as secretary of the Plumbers and Steamfitters union during a period of years.

Active pall bearers will be members of the union. They are Tom Harris, Charles Escott, Al Fraser, A. Lewis, Hart Steele and Wade Schrefler. Honorary pall bearers include Henry Jerrell, A. J. W. Schmid, Art Woods, Francis Reckhart, L. C. Smith and Joe Kopf.

Mr. Meisel is survived by his mother, Mrs. Margaret Meisel; a brother, Henry Meisel, and a sister, Mrs. Dave Sullivan.

He was among El Paso's pioneer residents, having lived in El Paso for 37 years and attended the local high school. Mr. Meisel is well known and has a wide circle of friends.

Funeral services will be Wednesday at 3 o'clock from Peak-Hagedon undertaking parlors.
