PIONEER EL PASOAN CLAIMED BY DEATH

Charles E. Miller Was Political and Business Figure

Funeral services of Charles E. Miller, 72, pioneer El Pasoan and member of the constitutional convention of New Mexico, are pending at Hartford mortuary today. He died yesterday.

Mr. Miller was born in Erfurt, Germany, and was educated in the public schools there. In 1880 he sailed for the United States, and became engaged in sheep raising in Bandera county, Tex. in 1882. In 1889 he moved to Anthony, N. M., where he opened a mill and general merchandise store.

He was formerly county commissioner of Dona Ana county, New Mexico state senate and county tax assessor.

Since Mr. Miller's health has been failing during the last few years, his wife has been managing the Plaza hotel at 400½ N. Oregon.

He formerly was with the Western Grocery Co. of El Paso.
