70-YEAR RESIDENT OF VALLEY IS DEAD

Tomas Miner of 512 Los Angeles street, a resident of El Paso and the valley for 70 years, died at his home today. He was 72.

Mr. Miner came to El Paso from Austin when he was two years old. He was a blacksmith in El Paso and became prominent in politics of the valley of the early days.

In 1913 he became a forest ranger and spent a large part of every year in the Black Range of New Mexico. He retired in 1930.

He is survived by his widow, a daughter, Miss Mary Miner, and a son, Ralph Miner, all of El Paso.
