

# Death Takes Edward Moye

## Funeral Rites Will Be Held Tomorrow For Pioneer El Paso Merchant.

Edward Moye, 78, pioneer El Paso merchant and banker, died at the family residence, 617 Cincinnati street, at 8:50 p. m. yesterday following a brief illness.

Mr. Moye, often termed the organizer of the jobbing trade in the El Paso territory was born and reared in San Antonio. In 1888 he came to El Paso with his family and became engaged in the jobbing business.

He was one of the organizers of the Krakauer-Zork & Moye Hardware company and remained in that business until 1911, when he retired to enter the banking field in El Paso. He sold his interests to the newly organized firm of Krakauer-Zork Hardware company.

### Organized Union Bank.

In 1911 he organized and controlled the Union Bank and Trust company. He guided the destinies of the bank until 1919, when he sold out to the Texas Bank & Trust company and retired.

Following the failure of the Krakauer-Zork Hardware company in 1924 he returned to the business field as a receiver for the firm. Four years later he had liquidated the assets of the company and paid off all debts. A new company was organized, the Zork Hardware company, and Mr. Moye retired definitely from business.

It was while he was connected with the firm of Krakauer-Zork & Moye that he conceived the idea of organizing and extending the El Paso trade territory into a huge jobbing field. Other merchants, seeing the advantages of his idea, followed his plan until all branches of the jobbing industry were included.

He was an organizer of the El Paso Chamber of Commerce and was one of its early presidents. He also helped to organize the El Paso Country club and was a past president of that organization. He was a member of the El Paso club.

### Funeral Rites Tomorrow.

Mr. Moye was married to Miss Lilla Zork, October 31, 1881. He and Mrs. Moye made their home in El Paso first on Magoffin avenue and later built a home at Oregon and Rio Grande streets, living there until 1916, when he moved to Kern Place. Mrs. Moye died two years ago.

He is survived by a daughter, Mrs. Reuben Weinstein, 617 Cincinnati street.

Funeral services will be held at the Peak-Hagedorn chapel at 9:30 a. m. tomorrow, with Rabbi Martin Zelonka officiating. Burial will be in Mt. Sinai cemetery. The family requests that no flowers be sent to the services.
