Death Takes **Edward Moye**

Funeral Rites Will Re Held **Tomorrow For Pioneer** El Paso Merchant.

Edward Moye, 78, pioneer El Paso merchant and banker, died at the family residence, 617 Cincinnati street, at \$150 p. m. yesterday fol-

lowing a brief illness.

Mr. Moye, often termed the organizer of the jobbing trade in the El Paso territory was born and reared in San Antonio. In 1888 he came to El Paso with his family and became engaged in the Jobbing business.

He was one of the organizers of the Krakauer-Zork & Moye Hardware company and remained in that business until 1911, when he retired to enter the banking field in El Paso. He sold his interests to the newly organized firm of Krakauer-Zork Hardware company.

Organized Union Bank.

In 1911 he organized and controlled the Union Bank and Trust' company. He guided the destinies of the bank until 1919, when he sold out to the Texas Bunk & Trust

company and retired.

Following the failure of the Krakauer-Zork Hardware company in 1924 he returned to the business field as a receiver for the firm. Four years later he had liquidated the assets of the company and paid off all debts. A new company was organized, the Zork Hardware company, and Mr. Moye retired definitely from business.

It was while he was connected with the firm of Krakauer-Zerk & Move that he conceived the idea of greanizing and extending the El Paso trade territory into a huge jobbing field. Other merchants, seeing the advaninges of his idea, followed his plan until all branches of the jobbing in-

dustry were included.

He was an organizer of the El-Paso Chamber of Commerce and was one of its early presidenty. He also below to transise the El Paso Country ditte and was a past president of that or polariton. He was a subsider of the Side chia.

Peneral Rites Tomerrow. Mr. More was married to Miss Lills Zork, Getober St. 1881. He and Mrs. Moye made their kome in El Paro first on Regolity evenue and lates built a home at Oregon and Rio Grando streets, living there until 1916, when he moved to Kern Place. Mrs. Moye died two years ago.

He is survived by a daughter, Mrs. Reuben Weinstein, 617. Cincinnati
