Francisco Munoz Dies In Ysleta

Francisco Real y Basques Munoz, 60, prominent Ysleta political and civic leader, died at his lower valley residence yesterday morning.

Mr. Munoz was born at Temosachic, Chihuahua, April 4, 1873, but moved to the United States with his parents when he was 13 years old. The family settled at Ysleta and there he made his home until his death.

He married Juana Ortega, daughter of Manuel Ortega, late chief of the Tigua Indians, at Ysleta, in 1890. In 1893 he was elected constable at Ysleta and held that office until 1908. He was a deputy sheriff under Seth Orndorff from 1920 to 1924.

After retiring from public office he returned to his farm and devoted his attention to personal affairs. He was a charter member of the United Citizens' Civic league.

He is survived by his widow; two sons, Isabel and Vicente Munoz, and five grandchildren, all of Ysleta.

Funeral services will be held at the Ysleta mission at 3 p. m. today. Burial will be in the Ysleta cemetery.
