

O. H. Palm, Seed Firm Owner, Is Taken by Death

O. H. Palm, owner of the Palm Seed and Plant Co., died in his residence at 1029 East Rio Grande street today.

Mr. Palm was 68. He had been a resident of El Paso for 34 years.

Mr. Palm was born in Galveston. He later moved to Austin, where he graduated from the University of Texas in 1900.

At the University, Mr. Palm majored in chemistry. He was elected captain of the Longhorn baseball team. He also was a member of Chi Phi fraternity.

He was married to Miss Imogene Hicks of Rockdale in 1906.

In 1912, he came to El Paso. He became an associate of G. P. Putnam in the management of the West Texas Fuel Co. In 1920, he purchased the W. D. Wise Seed Co., changing the name to the Palm Seed and Plant Co.

He was a member of St. Clement's Episcopal Church.

Mr. Palm is survived by his widow; two sons, Robert H. and John G. Palm, both of El Paso; a brother, John C. Palm of Austin, who was visiting here at the time of Mr. Palm's death, and three grandchildren.

Funeral services will be held at 2 p.m. tomorrow at Kaster and Maxon Chapel. Rev. W. G. Wright and Rev. B. M. G. Williams will officiate.
