

REV. PATTERSON RITES ARRANGED

Veteran Methodist Minister's Funeral Tomorrow

Funeral services for the Rev. J. F. Patterson, 91, Civil war veteran and oldest member of the Louisiana conference of the Methodist church, will be held at Trinity Methodist church at 10 a. m. tomorrow.

Dr. F. M. Freeman and Silas H. Jones, president of the Trinity Methodist church Bible class, will officiate. They will be assisted by Dr. W. S. Huggett, retired Methodist minister.

Burial will be in Concordia cemetery.

Rev. Patterson died at the home of a daughter, Mrs. Seth B. Orndorff, 1101 Baltimore, with whom he had made his home for 14 years.

He served as a private with the Confederate army during the Civil war.

Shortly after the war he was ordained a minister in the Louisiana conference of the Methodist church. He retired after 40 years of service.

He was a member of the Wade Hampton chapter of Confederate veterans.

Rev. Patterson was born in Natchez, Miss.

Besides Mrs. Orndorff, Rev. Patterson is survived by another daughter, Mrs. Carrie P. Myers, El Paso, and two sons, Dr. G. W. Patterson, Douglas, Ariz., and H. T. Patterson, New Orleans.
