MILLARD PATTERSON TO BE BURIED HERE

Former El Paso Attorney Dies in Phoenix

Millard Patterson, pioneer El Paso lawyer and former county, attorney, died yesterday in a Phoenix, Ariz., hospital after a short illness. He was 79.

Funeral services will be held at 2 p. m. Wednesday in the First Christian Church with Rev. A. A. Hyde officiating. Burial will be in Evergreen under direction of Peak-Hagedon mortuary.

Mr. Patterson was a former law partner of Judge Julius A. Buckler, who died in Akron, Ohio, Friday.

Mr. Patterson came to El Paso in 1883 and with his associates cleared up many land titles in and near El Paso.

Soon after his arrival in El Paso, he married Mrs. Lydia Ball, sister of Judge Buckler. After her death, he founded the Lydia Patterson Institute in her memory.

Later he married Mrs. Rose Buckler, who was the sister-in-law of the first Mrs. Fatterson.

Mr. Patterson was county attorney when asleta was the county seat.

Mr. Patterson had made his home in Los Angeles, Cal., since 1914. Three weeks ago he left his California home to visit friends in El Paso. When he left El Paso he went to Phoenix to spend the remainder of the winter. He suddenly became and his death followed in a few days.
