

C. T. Pelham Dies At 71

Pneumonia Fatal To Pioneer El Paso Resident And Builder.

Pneumonia last night caused the death of Charles T. Pelham, 71, pioneer El Paso resident and builder.

He was ill only a week.

Mr. Pelham came to El Paso 40 years ago to work for the American Smelting and Refining company. He worked continually for the company and never moved from the house he first occupied in the smelter area.

He was born on a ranch near Austin March 2, 1861.

After moving to El Paso he became interested in the development of real estate, and was one of the first men to visualize and develop Sunset Heights addition. He built four of the first houses in that section of the city 25 years ago.

He is survived by his widow; one daughter, Mrs. R. G. Folk, of El Paso, one sister, Mrs. E. C. Hull, of Ingleside, Tex., and two grandchildren, Robert and Rose Mary Folk. He was a brother of the late Will and Ed TenEyck, also pioneers of El Paso.

Funeral services will be held in the Peak-Hagedorn chapel at 4 p. m. tomorrow. Burial will be in the family plot in Evergreen cemetery.
