

# E. C. PEW DIES IN HOLLYWOOD

Pioneer Shoeman and Rank-  
ing Mason Here for Many  
Years; Burial Wednesday.

Edward Charles Pew, pioneer busi-  
nessman of El Paso and ranking Free-  
mason here for many years, died early  
Monday morning at his home, 6854  
Bonita Terrace, Hollywood, Cal., after  
a brief illness, according to word re-  
ceived at the local Scottish Rite Ma-

Mr. Pew for more than 20 years  
operated a shoe store on San Antonio  
street, moving to Hollywood several  
years ago. He was a member of the  
El Paso school board for a number of  
years. He was a past master of El  
Paso lodge No. 139 A. F. and A. M.,  
and past master of Oasis chapter No.  
5 Rose Croix, Scottish Rite Masonry.  
He was an inspector general, 23d de-  
gree of that rite. Mr. Pew was also  
a member of the El Paso Pioneers' asso-  
ciation, having come to the city during  
the early days of El Paso.

## *Edward Charles Pew, Pioneer of El Paso, Dies in California*

Edward Charles Pew, a pioneer of El Paso, died early Monday morning at his home, 6834 Bonita Terrace, Hollywood, Cal., according to news received by his son, E. W. Pew, accountant in the city waterworks office.

Mr. Pew came to El Paso in 1889. He was past master of the El Paso lodge No. 120 A. F. and A. M., past master of Oasis chapter No. 5, Rose Croix, Scottish Rite Masonry, past high priest of the Royal lodge chapter and most eminent commander of the Knights Templars of El Paso. He was also an inspector general, thirty-third, of the Scottish Rite Masonry. Mr. Pew was one of the foremost members of the El Paso Pioneers' association.

The funeral will probably be held Wednesday afternoon at 2 o'clock from his home at Hollywood, Cal. He is survived by his second wife, and son, E. W. Pew, of 701 East Rio Grande street.
