PRESTWOOD



Laura Nadine Prestwood passed away peacefully on March 30th at the age of 96. The daughter of John and Beulah (Hagood) Hale, Nadine was born

in Sherman, Texas in 1914. Her family moved to El Paso when she was a very young child. In 1938 Nadine married Hugh Loring Prestwood. They had two children, son Hugh Jr. and daughter Marvyn. Nadine earned a Masters Degree in history from the University of Texas El Paso in 1949. Her Master's thesis "The Social Life and Customs of the People of El Paso 1848 - 1910" is considered a valuable resource for historians interested in early El Paso. Juarez, and West Texas. In the 1950's Nadine began teaching for the El Paso Independent School District, eventually becoming a guidance counselor at several schools, including Ross Middle School and Jefferson High School. During this period she earned another Masters Degree from UTEP in guidance & counseling. In 1965 she began teaching Educational Psychology at the University of Texas at El Paso. By all accounts Nadine was an extraordinary and inspiring professor, touching many lives with her intelligence, dedication, and enthusiasm. Upon retiring from UTEP in 1986 she became the director of the Mary L. Peyton Foundation, a charitable organization which provides aid to needy El Pasoans. Remaining involved with the university, she served as a member of UTEP's Heritage Commission, and was a member of the Board of the Women's Department of the Chamber of Commerce. Equal to her educational accomplishments was her loving devotion to her two children, four grandchildren, and eight great-grandchildren. Both Hugh Jr. and Marvyn distinguished themselves; Marvyn as an educator - retiring as Principal of Bel Air High School in 2010 -- and Hugh as a songwriter, inducted into the Nashville Songwriter's Hall of Fame in 2006. Nadine is survived by son Hugh Prestwood Jr.; daughter-in-law Judy Ahrens; grandchildren Brian Prestwood, Jennifer Bustillos, Laura Porter and Lea Davis, and greatgrandchildren Brett and Brannon

Prestwood, Adyson and Andrew

Bustillos, Griffin and Jonah Davis, and Hayden and Mason Porter. A family memorial will be held at a later date. On the occasion of her 90th birthday Hugh composed a song, "Laura Nadine", the lyrics of which are printed below:
