## DEATH CLAIMS DR CHARLES T. RACE

El Paso Pionece and Former City Phy. sician and Health Officer Had Been

Sick a Long Time.

Dr. Charles T. Race; one of El Paso's pioneer citizens, died Friday night at 7:25 oclock at Hotel Dieu, after a long and painful illness. Dr. Race was 63 years old at the time of his death. He was assistant c. health officer and had been connected with the health department of the city cince 1885, having served both as health officer and city physician.

Dr. Race came to El Paso in 1883, and had lived here continuously since that time. He was a native of Covington, Ky., and was born August 7, 1851. He graduated from the university at Davenport, Iowa, in 1875, and in 1882 received his degree of doctor of medicine from the University of Louisiana. He moved to Texas, settling in Uvalde, in 1882, and there married Miss Carrie Henning. The next year he moved to El Paso.

Surviving him are his widow, a daughter, Miss Carrie Race, a son, Edgar A. Race, and a brother, Will E. Race, who is superintendent of the city water works, and a sister, Mrs. H. E. Reed, of Covington, Ky.

Dr. Race was a Mason and a member of the Knights Templar, the Blue lodge and the Royal Arch. He was also a member of the Elks and belonged to the Ploneers' association.

The funeral will start from the residence of W. E. Race, on Montana street, Sunday afternoon at 2:30 oclock, and the funeral service will be held in Trinity Methodist church at 3 oclock. Rev. C. Wesley Webdell, pastor of the church, will conduct the service. Burial will be in Evergreen cemetery.
