

RAILWAY CLERK OF G. H. DIED YESTERDAY

**Had Been In the Service
For the Past Eighteen
Years.**

Ike Rader, chief clerk to D. H. Fitzgerald, master mechanic of the G. H. died at his home, 901 Florence street, yesterday morning. He was 30 years of age and had been in railroad work since he was 12 years old.

He was the son of Pearson Rader, an engineer on the G. H., and moved here in 1887 with his parents. He started to work for the railroad the following year and was engaged in the service up to the time of his death.

The deceased was born in Wilkesbarre, Pa., and was married to Miss Bertha Ford, of El Paso, nine years ago. The bereft wife survives him.

He was well known in railroad circles in this city, having been in the railway service for 18 years. He was very popular among his fellow workmen and associates and held the esteem of his employer.

The funeral will be held from the late home, 901 Florence street, Sunday afternoon at 3 o'clock under charge of the Order of the Brotherhood of Railway clerks, and services will be held at the St. Clement's church at 3:30 o'clock. The reverend Henry Easter will officiate.

Interment will be in Evergreen cemetery.
