

MRS. W. A. RAWLS TAKEN BY DEATH

Was Member of Large And
Prominent Family In
Southwest

Mrs. W. A. Rawls, 1031 River St., El Paso resident for 34 years, died today at 1:30 a. m. at her home after a long illness. She was 50.

Funeral services will be held Tuesday with Peak-Hagedon Mortuary in charge.

Mrs. Rawls was the former Elizabeth Harrison of Socorro, N. M., member of a large family prominent in the Southwest. She came to El Paso in 1902 and was married to Mr. Rawls, road contractor and valley farmer, in 1904.
