

Actress Injured In El Paso, Dies

New York, Aug. 30 (AP).—Mrs. Julie Reinhardt, actress and suffrage worker, died today at the age of 80, after nine months of illness from dropsy. She had been ill since she fell 25 feet by stepping out of the wrong door of a theater in El Paso, where she was playing in "The Auctioneer."

She joined Henry Ward Beecher in 1868 in a fight for woman suffrage and for 40 years she talked from street corners and platforms in behalf of the movement.

The accident to Mrs. Reinhardt occurred at the old New Myar opera house on South El Paso street. The theater and stage were located on the second floor and she stepped outside, thinking it was the street.
