

Miss Opal M. Reynolds Dies of Heart Trouble

Miss Opal M. Reynolds, 30 years old, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Laurence Reynolds, died Saturday morning at 10 o'clock at the residence, 503 South Florence street. Miss Reynolds had been a teacher in the Effie Edgington school for two years.

Miss Reynolds was an active church member and took a leading part in the work at the Trinity Methodist church. She had a great many friends in El Paso and was very popular in church societies. Miss Reynolds assisted her father a great deal in his work as president of the Lydia Patterson Institute. Mr. Reynolds was formerly a missionary in Mexico City.

Miss Reynolds came to El Paso three years ago from Corpus Christi, Texas. She had lived in Texas all of her life. The deceased is survived by her parents, a young sister, Lucille; two brothers, Lawrence and Joe, of El Paso, and a brother, Wallace, in San Antonio, Texas. Funeral arrangements will be made later.

The funeral of Miss Reynolds will take place from the Trinity Methodist church Monday afternoon at 4 o'clock. Rev. P. R. Knickerbocker and Rev. J. H. Fitzgerald will officiate.
