

MR. JOSEPH SCHUTZ.

An Aged Citizen Passes Away in the Evening of a Beautiful Day.

Just as the sun was sinking behind the western mountain yesterday, Mr. Joseph Schutz breathed his last at his residence on Missouri street. He was surrounded by his family, who have been really expecting the sad moment for several days. Just one week ago he had a severe attack which proved to be abdominal tumor, and from which he experienced great suffering till the last.

Mr. Schutz came to El Paso in 1859 when there were but few people other than Mexicans living here. His brother Samuel Schutz, Mr. W. W. Mills and Mr. Simeon Hart being probably the others. From then till very recently he was engaged in mercantile pursuits, from which he gathered together a handsome competency. The number of his friends are legion, and many a one will endorse what Mr. Mills said last evening: "No man ever had a better neighbor than I have had in Mr. Schutz."

His family consists of his wife, a daughter, Miss Hattie, and three sons, Adolph, Charles and Julius.

The funeral will occur on Sunday at an hour to be announced in tomorrow's TIMES.
