

## DIES IN POVERTY

### SOLOMON SCHULTZ EXPIRES ON POOR FARM.

Pathetic Career of a Once Prominent  
Business Man of This City Who  
Lost All in His Old Age.

Solomon Schultz, an aged Hebrew who fifteen years ago ranked among the most prosperous of El Paso's business men, died at the county poor farm early yesterday from the ravages of old age. He was about 73 years old and was a native of Hungary.

At one time a man of affairs, his journey down the hard road of adversity to the poor house was pathetic in the extreme. Fifteen years ago Solomon Schultz established the California store on El Paso street and later sold it out to J. Calisher. Of a speculative turn, he then began to invest in valley lands east of this city and carried on fruit raising and general farming. Here his reverses began and losses followed losses until he was left without a cent. He had no relatives in this city and when the decrepitude of age came upon him he sought refuge where he died.

Some of the Jewish friends of the deceased will give the remains a Jewish burial in Concordia cemetery this morning.
