

Honor-Winning Art Teacher Taken by Death

Miss Nell Scott, art teacher in the El Paso schools for 10 years, died early today at the home of her parents in Waco, Tex. She was 44.

Miss Scott had been ill since January when she resigned from her position as head of the Austin High School Art Department.

Miss Scott had won recognition in Eastern art exhibits for herself and her El Paso students during those 10 years of work.

Her friends said today she was on the way to a national name in the art world. She exhibited in two large New York shows last year. Her picture, "Idle Boats," received honor in the 13th annual International Water Color Show at the Chicago Art Institute, in 1934.

Many of Miss Scott's students received awards in the annual art competition of the Scholastic magazine, in which she took a special interest, annually.

Miss Scott taught art at Beall School and El Paso High School before taking the Austin headship. She taught in Sul Ross College, Alpine, 1935, on leave of absence from the El Paso schools. She was a Sul Ross graduate. She studied at Columbia University.

She was the fiancee of the late W. K. Homan, brother of Dr. Robert B. Homan, whose death cut short their romance, eight years ago.

Miss Scott was born in Red Oak, Ia.

Funeral arrangements are pending in Waco.
