

FIRST MOTORMAN IN CITY; J. M. STARR, DIES; BURIED

The funeral of J. M. Starr, for nearly 20 years an El Paso resident, who died Monday, was held Wednesday afternoon at 2:30 o'clock. Interment was made in Concordia cemetery.

Mr. Starr was the first motorman to operate an electric street car in El Paso, and among those at the funeral was a large delegation of employees of the local electric railway. Decedent was 47 years old, and is survived by the widow, a son, Glenn, of the stereotyping department of the El Paso Herald; a brother, Harry E., of Alton, Ill., and a sister, Mrs. W. A. Armstrong, of Los Angeles, Calif.
