

Resident of City 59 Years Is Dead

Mrs. Horace B. Stevens, El Paso resident for 59 years, died today at her home at 412 Upson avenue. She had been in ill health five years.

Mrs. Stevens was 84.

She was born Abby Coggeshall Aug. 4, 1860, in Bristol, Rhode Island. She came to the Southwest as the bride of Horace B. Stevens, real estate and insurance man, in 1886. Except for a brief period spent in Arizona, the family has lived in El Paso, ever since.

Mr. and Mrs. Stevens were among the pioneers in the business and cultural development of El Paso. Mr. Stevens died in 1923.

Mrs. Stevens was a member of Church of St. Clement.

Survivors are: a son, Philip C. Stevens; two daughters, Mrs. Thomas D. Hurley and Mrs. Homer Jacobs; three grandchildren, Philip and Homer Jacobs Jr., and Miss Evelyn Stevens, and a nephew, Louis Coggeshall, all of El Paso.

Private funeral services will be held tomorrow at 11 a. m. with burial in Evergreen Cemetery beside the grave of Mr. Stevens. Rev. B. M. G. Williams will officiate.
