

Mrs. Aimee Stevens, El Pasoan For 50 Years, Taken By Death

Funeral services for Mrs. Aimee Stevens, widow of the late Walter

S. Stevens and a resident of El Paso for 50 years, will be held in the Hartford chapel at 9:30 a. m. today.

Mrs. Stevens died at a local hospital Wednesday, following a short illness.

Mrs. Stevens was born in Havana, Cuba, but moved to the United States with her parents as a child. The family settled in San Antonio, where Mrs. Stevens, the former Aimee Fennettee, was reared and educated.

After her marriage to Walter S. Stevens, the family moved to El Paso. Mr. Stevens was employed as a bridge contractor for the Southern Pacific line. The family remained in El Paso, and Mrs. Stevens resided in the home her husband built for

her at 609 East Missouri street until her death.

She is survived by two daughters, Mrs. Josephine Peters, Fresno, Calif., and Mrs. G. E. Vaughn, of Tulsa, Okla.

The Rev. W. S. Huggett, for years a friend of the family, will officiate at services this morning. Burial will be beside her husband's grave in the Knights of Pythias plot at Concordia cemetery.
