

# W. CASSEL STEWART DIES AFTER CRASH

Former City Engineer Here  
Victim of Accident

W. Cassel Stewart, 46, former city engineer, died last night in Parkersburg, W. Va., of injuries received in an automobile accident Wednesday. Mary Stewart, his sister, telegraphed C. R. Folk of El Paso today from Zanesville, O.

Mr. Stewart was a passenger in an automobile on his way to work when the car was struck and he was thrown out of the vehicle. His skull was fractured.

Funeral services were to be held at 2:30 p. m. today at Zanesville.

Mr. Stewart was a nephew of Gen. Anson Mills, El Paso pioneer. He was city engineer during the administration of Mayors Richard Dudley and Charles Davis.

Besides his sister, he is survived by a son, Robert, of Chicago, and his mother, who lives at Zanesville.

"Mr. Stewart was one of the best engineers the city ever had," said R. C. Semple, former alderman. "He was connected with such projects as the Scenic drive, Seventh St. drainage, and sewer work in Kern place.

"He planned the installation of about 30 per cent of all the city's sewers and much of the paving in Grandview, Altura and McKinley Ave. districts."
