

Funeral Services For Mrs. J. E. Swain Will Be Held Tues.

Funeral services for Mrs. Jennie E. Swain, 77 years old, who died Sunday morning in her apartment in 1217 East Yandell boulevard, will be held in the funeral home of the Peak-Hagedorn company at 4 o'clock Tuesday afternoon. Rev. T. V. Neal will officiate.

Mrs. Swain had resided in El Paso for 18 years, and was the mother of Harry Swain, prominent El Paso merchant. While suffering from heart attacks, Mrs. Swain was able to be up until Saturday night, when she became suddenly ill from another and more severe attack.

Mrs. Swain was a pioneer Texan and, with her parents, Mr. and Mrs. D. J. Parks, settled in Matagordo shortly after the war with Mexico. Her father died at the age of 93, and it was said that there were only two houses in the city of Galveston at the time the Parks family settled in Matagordo, Texas.

She was the widow of the late Henry Clay Swain, a native of New Orleans. The family home of the Swains was at Brenham, Texas, for many years, later she resided in

Fort Worth and came to this city to make her home in 1907. She was an active worker in the First Baptist church here.

The survivors of Mrs. Swain are two daughters, Mrs. George W. Phillips of Fort Worth, and Mrs. J. P. Nash of Tucumcari, N. M., who was with her at the time of death, and two sons, Harry of El Paso, and W. E. Swain of Laredo, Texas. Mrs. Phillips and W. E. Swain are expected to arrive in time for the funeral.
