

## Death Takes Pioneer El Pasoan



Mrs. Elizabeth Jane Terry, 90, widow of James Eli Terry, pioneer El Paso contractor, died at the home of her daughter, Mrs. L. A. Spencer, Upper Valley, yesterday.

Mrs. Terry, a resident of El Paso for 53 years, was a member of the Robert E. Lee Chapter, United Daughters of the Confederacy, of the local Rebekah Lodge and the Trinity Methodist Church.

Her husband, who died several years ago, constructed many of the older buildings in El Paso, including St. Clement's Episcopal Church.

She is survived by three daughters, Mrs. Spencer, Mrs. C. E. Pattison, Van Horn, and Mrs. W. E. Fletcher, Denver, Colo.; a brother, John Nelson, Douglas, Ariz., and a sister, Mrs. Molly McNeese, living in East Texas. Other survivors include 51 grandchildren and great-grandchildren.

Funeral services for Mrs. Terry will be conducted by the Rev. B. M. G. Williams at 2:30 p. m. Thursday in Peak-Hagedorn Chapel. Members of the Rebekah Lodge will conduct services at the grave. Burial will be in Evergreen.
