

Threadgill Services Thursday

Las Cruces, N. M. — Funeral services for a pioneer New Mexico rancher, W. W. Threadgill, 81, will be held at 4 p. m. Thursday in Las Cruces with Graham's Mortuary in charge. Burial will be in Masonic Cemetery.

Mr. Threadgill, who died after suffering a stroke Monday in the Castle Courts, which he owned, was born in Falls County, Texas, in 1877 and came to El Paso in 1913. He served with the Police Department for several years before turning to ranching in Rhodes Canyon near Engle, N. M.

He was the owner of a 160-acre ranch off Highway 54, near the early tin mines, which the Army bought from him in 1941 for a cavalry remounting station and which is now being used as a bivouac and training area for Nike units.

He was a member of the Las Cruces Elks Lodge and Montana Street Church of Christ in El Paso.

Survivors include his widow, Ruth; a daughter, Mrs. La Nelle Bradley; two grandsons, Jack Bradley and W. F. Bradley; three nephews, Leo Threadgill, E. S. Threadgill and J. B. Threadgill, all of El Paso; a niece, two sisters and two half brothers.
