

Crash Fatal To El Pasoan

**Mrs. Toenniges Resident
Since 1882, Succumbs
After Auto Hits Her.**

Mrs. Amelia Toenniges, 67, 1105 Arizona street, pioneer El Paso resident, died at a local hospital late yesterday of injuries received Wednesday when she was struck by an automobile at Montana and Octavia streets.

Mrs. Toenniges, police said, was struck by a car driven by William P. Brooks, 18, 1141 Rio Grande street.

Police said yesterday they will request that a court of inquiry be called to determine the facts in the accident.

Mrs. Toenniges was born at Vienna, Austria. She moved to San Antonio, Texas, with her parents as a child. In 1882 she came to El Paso to make her home, and two years later was married to Louis Toenniges.

Survivors are one son, C. A. Toenniges of El Paso; four daughters, Mrs. C. A. Preisig of Amarillo, and Mrs. G. G. Bakofsky, Mrs. M. T. Marker and Mrs. Sam Cohen, all of El Paso; a brother, C. Lux of Waco, Texas, four grandchildren and a great grandson.
