El Paso Woman Dies Of Burns In Airplane Wreck

Mrs. Georgie Trost, 34, wife of Leo J. Trost of the Franklin Automobile company, died at Rolston hospital at 4:30 oclock Thursday morning, as a result of burns received in an airplane accident near Los Angeles last summer. Mrs. Trost was brought here from Los Angeles Wednesday afternoon, accompanied by Dr. A. Palmer of Santa Monica, Calif. She was taken at once to Rolston hospital, where her death occurred a few hours later.

The women screamed but the pilot could not hear them for the roar of the engine and did not know that his plane was burning until he felt the heat. He immediately plunged the machine into the lake but not before his passengers were horribly burned. Mrs. Greene died soon after and she herself received teh burns which resulted in her death Thursday morning.

Mrs. Trost, who before her marriage was Miss Georgie Lambert, was born in Pontiac, Ill., 34 years ago. She received her early education in eastern schools and was a college graduate.
