

MRS. W. H. TUTTLE DIES IN HOT SPRINGS, ARKANSAS

Mrs. W. H. Tuttle, widow of the late W. H. Tuttle, pioneer El Pasoan, died Monday in Hot Springs, Ark., after several years of illness. Mrs. Tuttle has not resided in El Paso for several years, having sought a lower altitude on account of her ill health. She had recently gone to Hot Springs from California, thinking the change of climate would benefit her health. Billy and Joslin Tuttle, sons of deceased, left El Paso yesterday for Hot Springs, to accompany the remains of their mother back to El Paso. Miss Norma Tuttle, only daughter of deceased, arrived in El Paso today from La Jolla, Calif., where she was attending Bishop's school for girls. The remains are expected to arrive Friday and services, the time to be announced later, will be held in the Church of St. Clement, of which deceased was a member. The body will then be taken by the children to Los Angeles for cremation. Mrs. Tuttle, besides her children, leaves a sister, Mrs. Pierre Duillet, in San Francisco. Mrs. Tuttle was prominent in El Paso society a few years ago, before her health broke.
