Funeral Services For Pioneer Stage Driver Held Here

Col. Eugene Van Patten, 89, Butterfield Trail stage driver, Confederate veteran, scout and Indian fighter, died at 1:30 Sunday afternoon in the home of his daughter, Mrs. Amelia Asmrate, in Las Cruces. The funeral will be in the Catholic church there this afternon at 4, New Mexico National guard officiating.

Driving the mail over the Butterfield Trail, Col. Van Patten came to El Paso in 1859. After serving through the Civil war, he was scout for Gen. Nelson A. Miles and William Cody "Buffalo Bill." He was in business in El Paso and Juarez

in the early days.

Was Sheriff.

His experiences in New Mexico included that of sheriff in Dona Ana county when the whole of southern New Mexico had to be policed; deputy United States marshal, registrar of the general land office and colonel in the national

· guard.
