

## Henry B. Veck, 59, Taken By Death In Albuquerque

Henry B. Veck, 59, of the upper valley, died yesterday in the United States Veterans' hospital at Albuquerque after an illness of eight months. Funeral services will be held here at 2 p. m. today at Peak-Hagedorn mortuary with burial in Concordia cemetery.

Mr. Veck is well known among El Paso residents and those of the upper valley. He was in the dairy business for the past 14 years. He was born in San Angelo. He lived a short time in Roswell where he was married. He spent some time as an employe of the United States Reclamation service and built Leesburg dam in the upper valley. During the war he was with the Purity Baking company.

Mr. Veck was an Oddfellow and a member of the United Veterans of the Spanish-American war.

He is survived by his mother, Mrs. Kate Veck, San Angelo; two brothers and three sisters; and two sons, William S. and James D., upper valley.
