

Death Takes

W. G. Walz

**Headed Firm Founded
By Father Here
In 1881.**

W. G. Walz, 45, president of the W. G. Walz company, died suddenly at his home, 501 Robinson boulevard, at 1 p. m. yesterday.

Mr. Walz had been in ill health for several months, but his death was unexpected, friends said. He was found dead in the bathroom of his home. The body was discovered by Mrs. Walz and a nurse.

Death was due to a heart ailment, according to Dr. E. J. Cummins, his physician.

Mr. Walz was the son of a pioneer El Paso family and was head of the Walz company, the oldest mercantile firm in El Paso, founded by his father, W. G. Walz, in 1881. Mr. Walz succeeded to the head of the business at his father's death several years ago.

He was educated in El Paso schools and was a graduate of the New Mexico Military institute, at Roswell, N. M. He was a member of the El Paso Chamber of Commerce.

Mr. Walz is survived by his widow, Mrs. Frances Walz; three sisters, Mrs. A. H. Curry of Dallas, Mrs. Jennie Walz Turner of Los Angeles, and Mrs. W. K. Ramsey of El Paso, and a brother, Henry Walz of Pasadena, Calif.

Funeral arrangements are pending the arrival of Mrs. Curry from Dallas. Hartford Mortuary is in charge.
