Jack was born 15 March, 1927 in El Paso, Texas and died on 13 November, 2010 in Eugene, Oregon. He attended El Paso High School from 1941-1944 where he was on the football, track and rifle teams. He was also Captain of the ROTC which

led to him later serving in the Navy. Jack married Betty Jo Neely, also an El Paso High School graduate, in 1945. After starting college at Texas A&M, Jack transferred to Sam Houston State Teacher's College in Huntsville, Texas and received this Bachelor of Science degree. He then returned to Texas A&M to complete his Master's.

Most of Jack's professional life was spent in the public schools of California as a teacher, Vice Principal, Principal and Superintendent. Later, he was part owner of Northern California Tool and Supply in Chico, California. He sold his interest after

fifteen years and returned to El Paso to help care for his elderly father. After his father's death, he and his wife moved to Eugene, Oregon to be near their son and his family. In April, 2010, Jack and Betty celebrated their 65th wedding anniversary. He was passionate about music, history, poetry, riding his motorcycle and sailing on the San Francisco Bay, Puget Sound and off the west coast of British Columbia. His was a life well lived.

Jack is preceded in death by his father, El Paso architect, C.E. Waterhouse, mother, Lucille Rutledge Waterhouse and sister, Peggy Waterhouse Gonzales. He is survived by his brother, El Paso artist, Russell Waterhouse, wife, Betty Jo Neely Waterhouse, son, Rutledge Waterhouse, daughters, Jana Green, Betsy Whetstone and Peggy Waterhouse, twelve grand children and seven great-grand children.
