

Mrs. Waters Funeral Held Thursday

Graveside services for Mrs. Rosalie Behr Waters, 74, 506 Woodland, who died Wednesday, were held in Evergreen Cemetery Thursday afternoon. The Rev. Gene Myrick officiated the services.

Mrs. Waters was a native El Pasoan from a pioneer El Paso family. Her father was an early City official with the water department and her brother, Eddie Behr, was a reporter and city editor for The El Paso Times. He later moved to Los Angeles and was there referred to by William Randolph Hurst as the best reporter in the United States.

Mrs. Waters, a member of St. Clement's Episcopal Church, was the first president of the Junior League and was instrumental in the formation of the organization. In 1971 she donated her collections of valuable American art and decorative arts to the El Paso Museum and was honored by the museum for this.

She worked in the society departments of The El Paso Times and the El Paso Herald and was an honorary member of the League of United Latin American Citizens.

She was active in many civic organizations throughout her life and was especially devoted to assisting the Mexican people and poor children.

She had no immediate survivors. Arrangements were made by the Kastor-Maxon and Futrell Funeral Home.
