

William H. Watts, Pioneer, Is Dead

William H. Watts, 68, for 45 years a resident of El Paso and associated in the Watts firm that built the first water works system in El Paso, died yesterday morning at 10:30 o'clock at his home, 321 West Missouri street.

Mr. Watts is survived by his widow, Mrs. Jennie Watts, and a daughter, Miss Margaret Watts, in El Paso, and two daughters, Mrs. F. J. Brandenburg and Mrs. T. B. Tate, in Tulsa, Okla., also one son, William H. Watts, Jr., in New York city. Two brothers, James J. and Ed Watts, in El Paso, and a sister in California also survive.
