



WHITE

WYNDHAM KEMP WHITE died Sunday, December 22, in a local hospital. He was 75. White was born April 23, 1910 in El Paso. He was the son of Anne Perrin Kemp White and Hugh Spotswood White, M.D. He was graduated from El Paso High School in 1927 and received his college degree from Virginia Military Institute, Lexington, Virginia, in 1931. He received his law degree from the University of Texas Law School in 1935. White retired as a Lieutenant Colonel from the United States Army following World War II. His service included assignments as a military attaché in Ecuador prior to the war and with 19th Corps in the European Theater. He was awarded the Abdon Calderon Medal for meritorious service to Ecuador, the Croix de Guerre from France and the Bronze Star with Oak Leaf Cluster. After the war he returned to practice law in the firm later known as Kemp, Smith, White, Duncan and Hammond. Mr. White was a member of the American College of Trial Lawyers and the Texas State Bar. He was a past president of the El Paso Bar Association. He was a member of St. Clements Episcopal Church, one of the founders of the El Paso County Sheriff's Posse, El Paso Riding and Driving Club and Ditchriders International. White retired from the practice of law in 1980.

He rode with the Maryland Hunt Cup during his college years and was known throughout the southwest as a teacher of horses and young riders. He is survived by his wife, Constance Neville Rickard White, El Paso; daughters Edita White Simmons, El Paso and Anne White Airy, Seattle, Washington; sons Hugh C. White, El Paso, and Wyndham K. White, Jr., Odessa, Texas; and sons-in-law Dr. Jerry L. Simmons and James F. Airy. He is also survived by 4 grandchildren, Lee, Anne and Edward Simmons and Matthew Wyndham Airy. Funeral Services will be held at 10:00 A.M. Thursday at St. Clements Episcopal Church. Burial will be at Ft. Bliss National Cemetery, Rev. Ron Thomson, Rev. Delbert Achuff, and Rev. H.
