

Rites Arranged For Miss Mary Wilson

Funeral services for Miss Mary Wilson, pioneer El Pasoan who died yesterday, will be held tomorrow at 9:30 a. m. at St. Patrick's Cathedral. Miss Wilson was 64.

She was born in El Paso and was employed at the White House store for 47 years. Her father, Charles M. Wilson, drove the first Butterfield stagecoach into El Paso.

Miss Wilson lived at 917 North Stanton street. She is survived by three sisters, Mrs. Frank Corby of San Francisco; Mrs. Leonard Humphrey of Glendale, Calif., and Mrs. Guy Stapleton of Beaumont; and three brothers, Sammy J. Wilson of El Paso, Ruben of Jacksonville and Ed of Sheboygan, Wis.

Rosary services were set for 8 p. m. today at Kaster and Maxon chapel. Rev. John L. McGovern will conduct both the rosary and funeral services.
